WELCOME ADDITIONS TO THE MONUMENT PARKING LOT

On Earth Day two years ago, Joe Matisko, Berks Nature and Blue Mountain Wildlife combined efforts and planted a dozen trees in the area to the north of the Monument Parking Lot. Shortly thereafter, the local deer noticed the new trees and decided that they were very much worth the effort to eat. And eat they did. After two years, BMW counted five trees remaining. Fortunately, we humans tend not to give up and go home. We learn from our mistakes and do better. So, Berks Nature and Blue Mountain Wildlife tried again. This time Larry Lloyd of Berks Nature provided ten oak trees and two

sweet gum trees. He also promised five more trees in the future. Jim Turner rented an auger to dig the holes and procured topsoil to augment the rather poor soil in that area. With rain threatening the original Saturday planting date, the trees were planted quickly and with no issues on that Friday afternoon. They have been watered regularly since their planting by dedicated BMW volunteers like Jim Turner and Mike Kahl. Our hope is that they survive the first few seasons and grow to provide a healthy canopy over the area, ample opportunity for nesting birds, and plenty of acorns for the local wildlife.



MORE BLUEBIRD BOXES FOR THE BASIN

The next phase of Callen Rodriguez’ improvements project came to fruition on November 19th with the installation of thirteen new blue bird boxes. Callen, his mother Darla, Jim Turner, scout Weston Hertzog, and Weston’s father placed the boxes throughout the Basin, dou-
