Even though we've officially entered winter, it still hasn't stopped. 2018 ended up one of the wettest years on record, with the seemingly constant rain beginning at the end of July and lasting through the fall (for the most

part).

The wet weather seemed to put a damper on the activity at the Kernsville Dam Recreation Ar-The summer months are traditionally a slow period for Blue Mountain Wildlife. but they are the busiest for the Kerny. This year, however, what few activities Blue Wildlife Mountain planned to accomplish suffered delays to the wet weather. Fortunately, the two main events of the Blue Mountain Wildlife

summer season, the annual Dragonfly Walk in August and the Dine & Dash Burgers & Trail Race on Labor Day weekend, went off without a hitch, in spite of cloudy skies. A number of work projects, primarily those in support of Mackenzie Greenawalt's Native Plant Garden project, were delayed due to rain or muddy conditions. Eventually the project was completed, albeit a little later than scheduled.

> Visitor traffic at the Kerny seemed to be a little less this year, probably due to the rain that seemed to occur mainly on the weekends. This also seemed to be the case with trespassers headed to the Dam or to Pulpit Rock. While decreased trespassing will probably have no effect on whether the upper Kerny will be reopened to the public, it does generate less trash. which makes Blue Mountain Wildlife's efforts to keep the

area clean easier.

With winter here (at least according to the calendar), perhaps the rain will stop. Although that usually means snow instead.
